Job Description Overview

The overall responsibility of the Head Wrangler is to help facilitate the safe, efficient, and effective operation of the Camp OTX Barn. The Camp OTX Barn is home to approximately 18 horses, which are used for both Horsemanship classes and Trail Rides. Each summer, Camp OTX hires up to 4 college - aged young people to serve as wranglers. Camp OTX wranglers have the unique opportunity to use their horsemanship skills and work ethic to serve the overall mission of Camp OTX.

Wrangler Duties include, but are not limited to:

- Care and feeding of Camp OTX's horses
- Care and maintenance of Barn tack, equipment and supplies
- Teaching of various Horsemanship classes
- Supervising Trail Rides through the Texas Hill Country
- Teaching and supervising campers as they ride horses during Morning Activities, Stampede and Special Events
- Be a part of our dynamic team and be flexible to help in other areas when the barn is not in use

The Head Wrangler must help our other Wranglers learn valuable lessons in Horsemanship instruction, Equine care, teamwork, and Barn operations. All Wranglers work under the direction of full-time Camp OTX staff, and play a crucial role in the experience, ministry, and outreach of Camp OTX. Previous experience working with horses is required.

Finally, the ideal candidate is quick to adapt and assist in other areas around camp when the barn is not in need of attention. All Wranglers get to work in an exciting, kid-oriented Christian environment alongside talented and passionate college students. The hours are long and the work is challenging, but the job is very rewarding!
